



ADMINISTRATION BUILDING THE GRASS CENTER



40,737 SQ. FT. | BACK OF BUILDING FACES 2ND STREET

- U-shaped driveway for pick-up/drop-off
- Fully ADA accessible
- Equipped with elevator & plenty of parking
- Small side lot & underground parking



ADMINISTRATION BUILDING THE GRASS CENTER



1ST FLOOR

- Meeting and event space
- One area holds up to 200 people and opens up onto the green space overlooking the river

2ND FLOOR

• Fitness Center overlooking the river

3RD FLOOR

- JCC & Federation Staff
- Jewish Community Foundation of Central PA









RICHARDS HALL



14,793 SQ. FT.

- Outdoor seating/ gathering area
- Equipped with elevator & fully ADA accessible
- Two-way driveway behind the building with a lane for handicap parking



RICHARDS HALL



14,793 SQ. FT.

1ST FLOOR

- Large meeting space
- Art Gallery
- Catering kitchen

2ND FLOOR

• 2 large classroom/ meeting spaces

3RD FLOOR

• Game tables, spaces for gathering - from teens to new parents to seniors



DUNCAN HALL BRENNER FAMILY EARLY LEARNING CENTER




17,530 SQ. FT.



- Plenty of classroom space for infants through PreK
- Space for a dedicated fenced in playground
- Connects directly to new Sports Center
- Equipped with elevator & dedicated parking lot




BEHIND DUNCAN HALL SPORTS CENTER



17,530 SQ. FT.

- PIAA-regulation sized basketball court with 200+ bleacher seating
- 4 Pickleball Courts
- Converts to an auditorium and event space
- Pool for swimming laps, aquatherapy, lessons, and classes





SOUTH HALL SILVER ACADEMY



10,547 SQ. FT.

- 4 floors of classrooms that are fully outfitted with AV and latest technology & equipment
- Equipped with elevator & easy pick-up/drop-off driveway with added turnaround space



MCCORMICK HOUSE JEWSH FAMILY SERVICE



5,355 SQ. FT.

- Separate access via Graham St.
- Convert residential property to meet the needs of JFS:
 - Add elevator for accessibility
 - Convert rooms for office staff and optimal service delivery




HUGHES HALL OFFICE SPACE




10,547 SQ. FT.

ASSUMPTION 1

JCC programs can - and should be profitable and self-sustaining based on peer communities, all of which face the same competition for gym membership and programming

GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES

Diversity Programming

Avoid reliance on too few programs for revenue

Opportunity to partner with other community organizations, (i.e. healthcare providers)

Consider Profitability

Increase fees: New facility justifies modest increases Facility & room rentals Consider both mission and revenue in programs



ASSUMPTION 2

Based on peer community data, JCC Membership can increase (flat for over a decade at 738) individuals/households)

There is ample opportunity to increase JCC membership in both the Jewish & non-Jewish communities

GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES

Identify Value Proposition

Offer value-add with membership (special access/ fees for members, etc.)

Drive new members with high-end facility and offerings

Goals to Grow

Dedicated staff to drive membership

Leverage data to drive growth from targeted segments of the population to increase Jewish & non-Jewish membership



ASSUMPTION 3

Given regional demographics **Annual Campaign Donors** (885 individuals/ households) is low compared to peer communities

There is opportunity for greater Jewish community engagement.

GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES

Deepen & Broaden **Annual Campaign** Participation

Energize the community around a new centralized home

Increase the number of donors and size of gifts

Allocate Funds to Jewish **Community Priorities**

Increase amount allocated to Jewish agencies

Reinstate an allocation to Israel



GROWTH OPPORTUNITIES

ASSUMPTION 2 \rightarrow And by focusing on and maximizing membership growth, ASSUMPTION $3 \rightarrow$ The annual campaign can be an opportunity to advance Jewish life

ASSUMPTION 1 \rightarrow Through profitable, diversified, and self-sustaining JCC programs,

in Harrisburg and deepen our connection to Israel.



SUSTAINABLITY




CREATE CAMPUS ENDOWMENT FUNDS

- Lessons learned from previous renovation
- 20-30% of budget by Year 6 comes from endowment funds
- Naming rights in perpetuity to cover ongoing operating costs for the facility





PROJECTED REVENUE BREAKDOWN – IN LINE WITH PEER JCCS



PROGRAMS | MEMBERSHIP | GRANTS & DONATIONS | ENDOWMENT

Membership is currently just 11% of revenue; increasing to 20% assumes both more total members and slight increase in fees.

Current Grants & Donations are at 42% This is a much more balanced revenue structure.


